ECONOMIC INCENTIVE BILL PASSES FIRST MAJOR TEST IN SENATE

The <u>Kansas Senate</u> advanced a <u>measure</u> that would provide massive economic incentives for a yet-to-be announced company and project that has been the subject of massive speculation for weeks. The bill is being pushed hard by the Governor's office, and by some members of House and Senate leadership, who are trying to win a massive manufacturing project that is expected to bring in \$4 billion in investment to the state. It is also supposed to generate an annual investment of \$2.5 billion in economic activity and create 8,000 jobs, making it one of the biggest deals in Kansas history.

An <u>amendment</u> made in committee, proposed by Senate Commerce Chairwoman <u>Renee Erickson</u> (R-Wichita), would do the following:

• Remove the refundable element of the Investment Tax Credit.

- Add a 0.5 percent corporate tax reduction for the taxable year following the receipt of any benefits by a qualified firm or supplier under the Act.
- Make various technical changes to the bill.

Erickson further amended the bill on the Senate Floor to:


- Establish a sunset of March 31, 2023, on and after which no new agreements with a qualified firm or qualified supplier may be entered into by the Secretary of Commerce.
- Define term "foreign trade zone" and amend the definition of "qualified supplier".
- Amend requirements under which a qualified firm must repay benefits.
- Clarify qualified firms and suppliers are disqualified from receiving benefits under any other economic development program administered by the Department of Commerce.
- Clarify that qualified suppliers must be certified by the Secretary of Commerce prior to receiving the sales tax exemption.

After a shorter than expected debate, the Senate passed the bill 32-7. The House Commerce Committee is scheduled to hear the bill next Monday. Proponents are hoping to advance the bill and send to the Governor's desk as soon as possible to remain in the site selection competition.

LEGISLATURE PASSES CONGRESSIONAL REDISTRICTING MAPS

After a mere three weeks into the 2022 Legislative Session, both the House and Senate have passed a Congressional Redistricting map. After the Senate passed the map last week, the full House took up the issue on Tuesday.

As anticipated, the key issue in the House was, like the Senate, how to redraw the current lines of the growing Third Congressional District, which exceeds the federally



prescribed district size by 44,000 people. The House eventually affirmed the plan after nearly 4 hours of debate by a vote of $\frac{79-37}{2}$.

The map will now head to the Governor's desk.

SPARK INVESTMENT IDEA SUBMISSION FORM FOR ARPA DOLLARS RELEASED

The Strengthening People and Revitalizing Kansas (SPARK) Executive Committee released a statement today asking for residents to submit their investment ideas for ARPA dollars through an <u>online portal</u>. The press release notes that the submissions will help assist the four <u>SPARK Advisory Panels</u>: Health & Education, Economic Revitalization, Connectivity, and Efficiency & Modernization, make

recommendations to the <u>Executive Committee</u> and the State Finance Council. In making decisions, SPARK will adhere to the following guiding principles:

- Prioritize sustainable programs & investments through one-time use of funds vs. substantial expansion of existing services
- Combine with / leverage local and agency funds to maximize use of discretionary funds
- Foster long-term systemic impact for Kansans
- Consider equitable opportunities and outcomes
- Enable flexibility within investment strategies
- Ensure results are measurable to enable tracking & transparency

Interested parties are instructed to complete the submission form in its entirety. The submission period will close on **February 16, 2022**.

COMPUTER SCIENCE BILL TO BE HEARD

The <u>House Education Committee</u> will hear a <u>bill</u> next week that would allocate nearly \$2 million to create a grant to both benefit both students and teachers who are looking to pursue further computer science education. The proposal would establish the Computer Science Education Advanced Grant Fund. The <u>State Board of Education</u> would award grants to professional learning providers to develop and implement professional development programs for computer science programs to be taught in the state. It would also prescribe various requirements for offering computer science courses in high school, as well as provisions for how new and existing teachers would be recruited and trained to teach such courses.

The hearing on the bill has been rescheduled, due to a long floor debate, for Tuesday, February 1, 2022.

MASSIVE HEARING BEFORE SENATE LOCAL GOV. COMMITTEE ON KANSAS RENEWABLE ENERGY TRANSPARENCY ACT

The <u>Senate Local Government Committee</u> held hearings this week on <u>SB325</u>, which pertained to zoning requirements and the recording of easements and leases for wind and solar energy projects. After July 1, 2022, this bill would require that before project developers could secure a building or special use permit the property must be zoned industrial. The bill also provides for a protest of a rezone if 10% of the electors petition the county commission for a referendum on the rezone. If the election is successful, the rezone will not occur, and that property cannot be rezoned industrial for 4 years. Additionally, any leases or easements for a wind or solar project must be recorded with the Register of Deeds within 30 days, the project is void.

Proponents for the measure noted that project developers secure property leases before securing zoning or regulatory proposals. Many leases also include "gag orders" that prevent leaseholders from sharing information about the project or the terms of the lease. The project developers use the leases to force county commissions to approve the project. Supporters said they see SB325 as providing transparency during this leasing process.

Opponents noted that the bill is very restrictive for the siting and development of wind and solar energy projects. They also note that companies who erect renewable energy sites work closely with landowners and counties have been good about creating sufficient regulations that are consistent with industry standards.

The bill has not yet been scheduled to be worked.

<u>DEPARTMENT OF LABOR APPEARS BEFORE JOINT COMMITTEE TO GIVE UPDATE ON UNEMPLOYMENT SYSTEM</u>

After nearly two years of controversy surrounding its unemployment fraud and IT system, the Kansas Department of Labor presented an update before a Joint hearing of the <u>House</u> and <u>Senate</u> Commerce Committees. Secretary Amber Schultz, who was <u>appointed</u> at the end of January, told the Joint Committee that while unemployment claims had ticked up slightly, more of them were legitimate filings compared to figures from a year ago. Overall, it is estimated Kansas has paid roughly \$700 million in fraudulent employment claims in 2021.

The Secretary also noted that KDOL is completing its RFP process after the original RFP was published in April of 2021. The detailed slide deck from the Secretary showing statistics on unemployment insurance claims and modernization updates can be found here.
