# TAXES, MEDICAID EXPANSION, WORKFORCE & MENTAL HEALTH ALL KEY PILLARS IN GOVERNOR'S STATE OF THE STATE

After having to delay due to a false-positive COVID test, Governor Kelly finally addressed a joint Session of the House and the Senate on Tuesday night. Her fifth State of the State address was delivered as Republicans hold supermajorities in both the House and Senate. Some major themes from her speech included the following:

- Taxes: The Governor emphasized her continued push to cut the sales tax on food immediately and increasing the income threshold when it comes to taxing social security benefits. She also touched on a sales tax holiday for school supplies, and eliminating taxes on diapers and feminine products. The Governor did not mention Republican's flat tax proposal explicitly, but did warn against any policy that would damage the state's current fiscal footing.
- Medicaid Expansion: Medicaid expansion continued to be a theme for the Governor, despite what many see as a difficult path forward. She noted that with rural hospitals closing their doors, the ability for many to receive care becomes more difficult as distance increases. Further, the Governor noted that \$6 billion worth of federal funds has not reached Kansas because the state has not expanded.
- Medical Marijuana: Kelly also asked the Legislature to legalize Medical marijuana. Using personal stories of specific Kansans who would have benefited greatly during times of extreme pain and

- illness, she implored upon the Legislature to do what numerous other states have already done with their medical marijuana laws.
- Workforce Development: Continuing on a theme that was seen in her budget, the Governor touted the recent major economic development victories under her watch, but asked for continued help to recruit and retain workers. Although Kansas has been the beneficiary of major projects, such as the Panasonic battery factory in De Soto and other similar projects that have helped create 54,000 new jobs, the state has stagnant population growth. The Governor hopes that continued investment in public schools (including fully-funded special education), higher education, and more registered apprenticeships will help keep skilled workers in the state and reverse that trend.
- Mental Health & Drug Prevention: Many facets of mental health and drug abuse were discussed on Tuesday. The Governor called for mental health care for first responders, the expansion of mental health intervention teams and increased investment in state mental health services. She also noted there has been an increase in drug use and drug overdose deaths largely driven by fentanyl and asked for decriminalization of fentanyl testing strips. Of note, the Governor said that Kansas saw the nation's second-highest increase in drug overdose deaths in the nation.

## **MASTERSON DELIVERS GOP RESPONSE**

In a <u>prerecorded response</u>, Senate President <u>Ty Masterson</u> called on Governor Kelly to truly govern from the middle and help sign into law a number of Republican policies. The remarks, which can be found <u>here</u>, began with an acknowledgement that the Republican Party was "divided" which paved the way for the Governor to win a second term with less than 50% of the vote. Despite this, Masterson said he hoped to work with the Governor to advance Republican's "<u>A Better Way</u>" agenda. Specifically, the Andover Republican touched on the following items:

- <u>Taxes</u>: Masterson said that he was happy to see the Governor committed to lowering the
  retirement tax burden, and hopes to work together with her to make this a reality. He also hoped
  she would meet him in the middle and sign a flat tax proposal that was introduced by Republicans
  last week.
- <u>Debt Reduction</u>: The Senate President dismissed the Governor's ability to balance a budget, stating this was not a hard feat with billions in federal dollars being given to the state. He called for her to responsibly use this money and the current budget surplus by putting it into the state's rainy day fund and pay off state debt.
- <u>Education</u>: A major focus of Masterson's response was education and related topics. The
  Governor should focus on students, he said, and not legacy systems and "woke" agendas. This
  could be done by signing the <u>Parent's Bill of Rights</u> and the <u>Fairness in Women's Sports Act</u>, both
  bills that the Governor has vetoed in recent years. He also said Republicans were committed to
  expanding educational choice opportunities for all students.
- <u>Energy</u>: Reducing energy rates, Masterson said, is a goal for his caucus. To achieve this, however, the state would need to have an "all of the above" energy policy, which includes use of gas, coal and nuclear power sources not just renewables.
- <u>Healthcare</u>: Masterson rejected any notion of Medicaid expansion in his speech. Rather, he said, GOP members would be focused on cost transparency, more competition, and less regulation over consumer choices to help bring down the cost of healthcare. He also said a safety net for those most vulnerable would continue to be supported.

#### HOUSE TAX COMMITTEE TACKLES PROPERTY TAX NOTIFICATIONS, TAXING OF SOCIAL SECURITY

The <u>House Taxation Committee</u> started off the year moving at breakneck speed to hear bills spanning from property tax notifications to social security income thresholds.

On Tuesday, the Committee heard <u>HB 2002</u> which would direct the state to continue covering costs for taxpayer notification printing and postage. In 2021, lawmakers passed a bill that would require all taxing jurisdictions to mail notices to taxpayers any time a local jurisdiction was planning on exceeding its revenue neutral rate. Proponents noted that the measure, known as the <u>"Truth in Taxation" law</u>, would provide more transparency and oversight and result in lower property taxes. Some local governments argue that incredibly small taxing jurisdictions would have difficulty paying for the notices. The bill, sponsored by Rep. Brett Fairchild (R-St. John), has a \$1.3 million annual fiscal note.

The committee also heard <u>HB 2107</u> and <u>HB 2109</u>, pertaining to the income threshold for purposes of taxing social security income. The current threshold is \$75,000 for all classes of taxpayers to qualify for the SSI modification. HB 2107 raises the limit for total subtraction of SSI benefits for earners up to \$100,000 with a proportional stair-step modification for income between \$100,000 and \$125,000. HB2109 would create a partial modification between \$75,000 and \$100,000 and would consider the taxpayer's filing status using a compound formula. It is estimated that approximately 175,000 of the current 240,000 taxpayers paying on SSI benefits would be impacted by this legislation at a cost of \$120 million per year.

### **NEW SENATOR WINS AND IS SWORN IN**

<u>Tim Shallenburger</u> (R-Baxter Springs) officially won his precinct election on Sunday and was quickly sworn in on Monday afternoon. Shallenburger, a Republican, will replace <u>Richard Hilderbrand</u> (R-Baxter Springs) who retired earlier this year. He is the former State Treasurer (1987-1998) and Speaker of the House (1999-2003). He also was Legislative Director for former Governor Sam Brownback, Chair of the Republican Party and gubernatorial candidate against former Governor Kathleen Sebelius.

Shallenburger will serve on the <u>Judiciary</u>, <u>Local Government</u>, <u>Transparency & Ethics</u> and <u>Transportation</u> Committees. He will serve out the remainder of Hildebrand's term.

## **BUSY WEEK AHEAD**

Next week, we expect to see more committee activity as hearings are scheduled for the bills introduced over the past two weeks. Further, more committees will begin hearing budgets for various state agencies and departments.

Of note, a hearing will be held for <u>SB 47</u> which is a modified version of the auxiliary container bill passed <u>last session</u> but vetoed by the Governor.

Additionally, <u>SB 91</u> relating to incentivizing film, video and media production in the state will be held Thursday.

The Senate version of the Social Security Income tax limits bills, <u>SB 80</u>, will be held Tuesday in <u>Senate Assessment & Taxation Committee</u>.

Finally, <u>SB 67</u> relating to the transfer for \$1,000,000,000 from the state general fund to the stabilization fund will be held in <u>Senate Ways & Means</u> on Tuesday.
